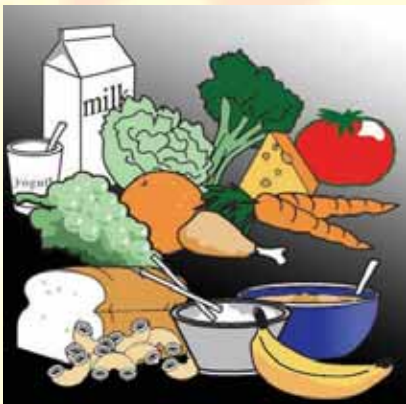

Water's Invisible Skin

When water drips from a faucet, it takes the shape of a balloon before it falls. Every drop seems to be covered with a tightly stretched skin. This is surface tension.

Do this experiment to see the strength of surface tension: Fill a bowl with water. Ask your parents for a sewing needle (not a straight pin). Place the needle on a fork and very carefully lower the fork into the bowl of water. The steel needle will remain on top of the water, supported by surface tension.

Look closely and you will see how the water curves up all around the needle. This is because the needle is resting **ON** the water, and not **IN** the water like a boat.
