What's the funniest movie you have ever seen? *Wedding Crashers*? *Dodgeball*? *Zoolander*? Those movies are funny, but funnier movies were made before you were born.

In the 1930s many performers who began in vaudeville (funny plays with song and dance) made the leap to moving pictures.

The funniest vaudeville act to turn to movies was The Marx Brothers. Harpo, Groucho, Chico and sometimes Zeppo were a team of sibling comedians.

*Duck Soup* might be the funniest movie ever made. It's about a crazy war between Sylvania and Freedonia. This is the last Marx Brothers' movie that included Zeppo, whose job as "straight man" was to set up the others' jokes.
